

Keeping you on target – Debbie Alston

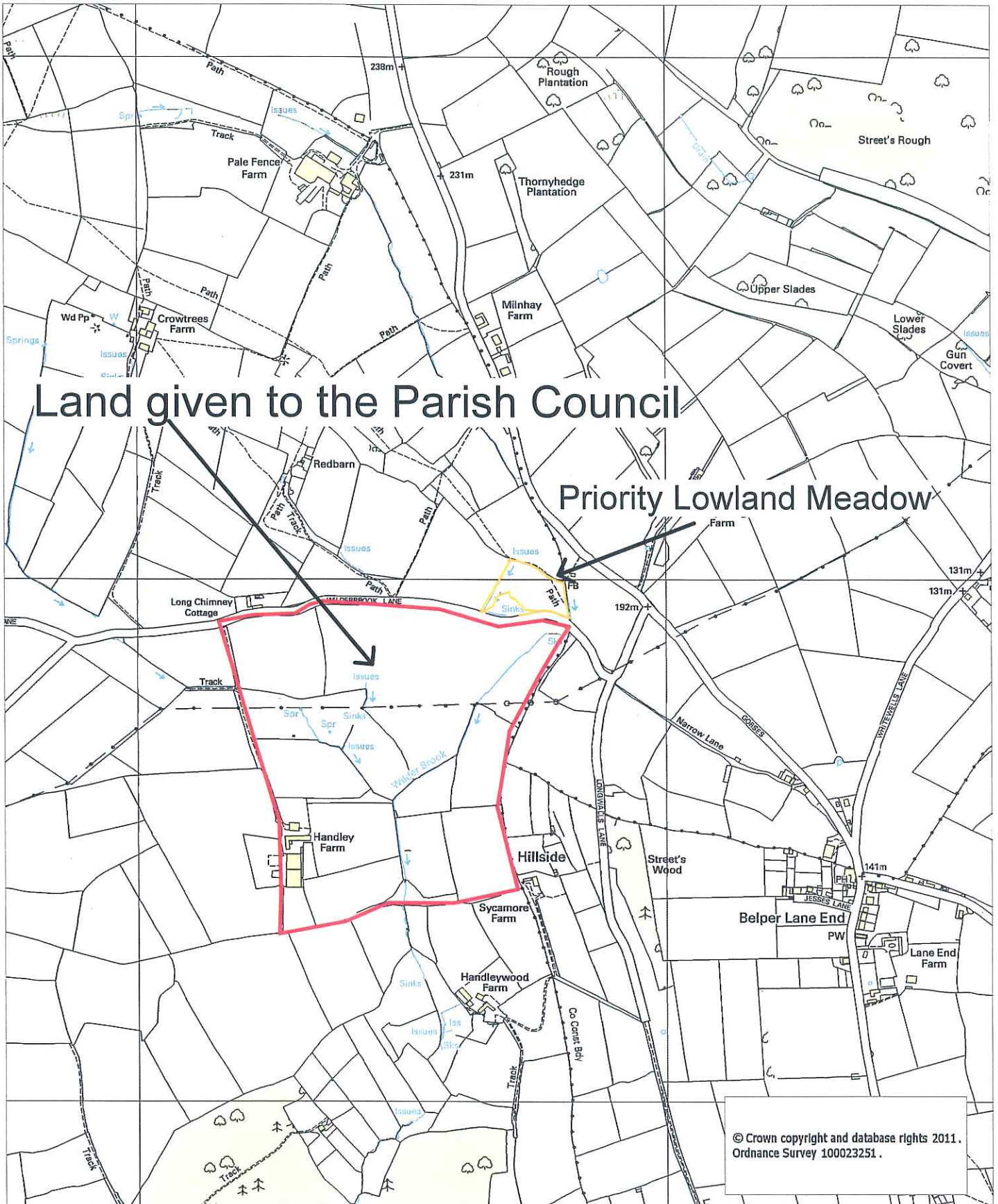
The workshop started up by going through the various parts of the new LBAP, demonstrating the hyper-links and discussing how it could be used by partners for their own projects and future funding bids.

Local Case Study: Handley Farm (Completely fictitious example!)
